## **KEYNOTES**

#### Project Management in Action: UN **Intelligent Wide Area Network**

The United Nations, Service for Geospatial Information and Telecommunication Technology (SGITT) adopted project management best practices for managing wide variety of projects. The Wide Area Network Section (WANS one of SGITT sections) was tasked to Improve the UN global network connectivity by using more efficiently the existent resources, reducing cost increasing capacity and improving performance. In this session we will discuss how the expressed requirements were leading to three different initiatives that were resulting in a more costly deployment of three different technical solutions and how using project management best practices is helping us to align the project objectives and actions, identifying risk and opportunities, implementing necessary adjustment, and steer toward a significant improvement outcome as expected.
